Our Guest Speaker, Dave McCleary, founder of End Human Trafficking Now shared the organization's mission of advancing awareness, driving individual action and helping communities put an end to human trafficking and modern day slavery. Many believe human trafficking to be a third world problem, but there were more than 10,000 suspected cases of human trafficking in the United States last year. The average age for trafficked children is 12-14 years. Although this is difficult subject to discuss, Dave also shared stories of hope, where victims have been removed from the cycle of human trafficking and received transformative care. Dave encouraged us to look at what we can do, rather than what we can't. Please visit endhtnow.org for ways you can help. 


Our CPR/AED Training Crew is Expanding Our Reach!
