- Women served by EWW face numerous challenges
  - 100% are low income
  - 98% are head of household
  - 67% receive government assistance
  - 46% have criminal backgrounds
  - 25% have participated in a substance abuse program
- The Bees Program, EWW's 6-week intensive program, provides extensive training in empowerment, health and wellness, employment and interviewing skills, job coaching, and life skills. 98% of graduate and secure employment. 90% sustain employment for over 6 months.
