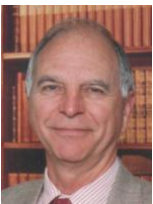

To begin, five men and a mission...

In late 1920, Thomasville's Rhydon Mays visited the Rotary Club of Albany where his brother was a member. Historical accounts say Mays soon "began agitating" friends and business associates to establish Rotary in Thomasville. A five-man organization committee was established and, on March 26, 1921, chairman J.B. Jemison, wholesale lumberman; Ed Jerger, newspaper editor; Bob Balfour, crates and baskets manufacturer; Hansell Watt, hardware merchant; and Rhydon Mays, cotton broker, met. Their first mission—designate 20 prominent business and professional men as potential members. Rotary International set the initial membership based on Thomasville's population.

Will Watt, Sr. began the Georgia Rotary Student Program as a member of the Thomasville Rotary Club at the conclusion of World War II. He founded GRSP to promote worldwide peace. Some 75 years later well over 3,000 students have traveled to Georgia from around the world to study in Georgia universities and colleges as a result of GRSP. During the 75th Anniversary event over 300 Rotarians and their guests will be in Thomasville to attend the event and honor the memory of Will Watt, the founder of GRSP.
