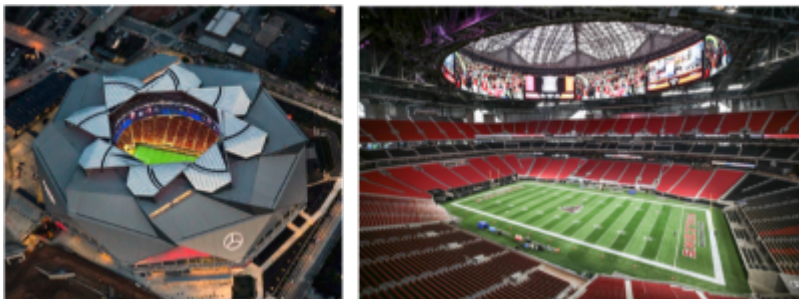


President John's Message
